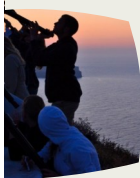

Learning occurs with the supports of immersion-excursion institutes in international and domestic contexts rich in integrative study potential. Summer School and Summer Field Studies Abroad:

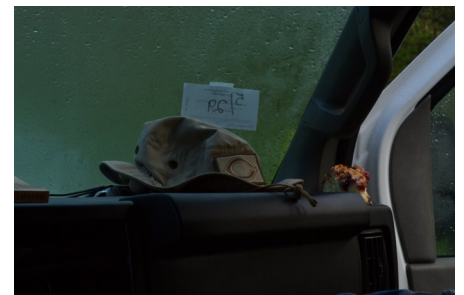
